On Thursday, July 12, 2018, Kenner Police Detective Aaron Savoie was contacted by Squad 4, Sergeant Greg Smith. Sergeant Smith informed Detective Savoie that Austin Boyles, Date of Birth 5-12-1995, who was in Kenner Police Custody was transported to Ochsner Kenner by EJ Ambulance in reference to him "huffing" multiple cans of compressed air. While being treated by medical personnel Austin Boyles experienced an unknown medical emergency and became unresponsive.

Detective Savoie responded to Ochsner Kenner and met with Hospital Staff who advised at 2247 hours, Austin Boyles death was pronounced, by Emergency Room Physician (Doctor) Dr. Seymour.

Based on the fact that this death occurred while Austin Boyles was in Police Custody, Lieutenant Michael Cunningham requested Detective Savoie to complete to conduct an investigation into Austin Boyles's death.

Detective Savoie will complete an investigative report concerning this incident.

On Thursday, July 12, 2018, Kenner Police Detective Aaron Savoie was contacted by Squad 4, Sergeant Greg Smith. Sergeant Smith informed Detective Savoie that Austin

Boyles (Date of Birth 5-12-1995), who was in Kenner Police Custody under Kenner item number G-80626-18, was transported to Ochsner Kenner by an East Jefferson Ambulance in reference to him "Huffing" multiple cans of compressed air (Dust-OFF) which he had stolen. While being treated by medical personnel Austin Boyles experienced an unknown medical emergency and became unresponsive.

At approximately 2308 hours, Detective Savoie responded to Ochsner Kenner and met with Hospital Staff who advised at 2247 hours, Austin Boyles' death was pronounced, by Emergency Room Physician (Doctor) Dr. John Seymour.

Upon speaking to Dr. Seymour briefly, he advised that Austin Boyles had possibly died of "Sudden Sniffing Death Syndrome" from the "inhalation of hydrocarbons," however an autopsy will be needed to confirm.

Lieutenant Michael Cunningham, Sergeant Adam Schouest, and Detective Brad Rieke, arrived shortly thereafter and was apprised of the incident.

Based on the fact that this death occurred while Austin Boyles was in Police Custody, Lieutenant Cunningham requested Detective Savoie to conduct an investigation into Austin Boyles's death.

While on scene Detective Savoie requested Detective Rieke to contact the Jefferson Parish Coroner's Office and request an investigator to the hospital, which he agreed to do.

While on scene Detective Savoie inspected Austin Boyles' body. During initial observation the detective observed irregular elongated scarring on his arms and chest, along with three moderate injuries on the chest which appear to be burn marks (one right below the neck line, the other on the left collar bone, and the third on the chest between the nipple and left arm). Detective Savoie continued to review Austin Boyles' injuries and observed a contusion above his right eyebrow.

On July 13, 2018, at approximately 0015 hours, Sergeant Schouest left Ochsner Kenner, proceeded to the Kenner Police Complex in order to begin to conduct interviews with involved officers, while Detective Savoie proceeded to Walmart, 8912 Veterans Boulevard, Kenner, in order to meet with Detective Devin Diedling who identified the witnesses and requested them to stay at the location.

At approximately 0041 hours, Detective Savoie met with Detective Diedling who advised that two of the witnesses had left, however Pink Duckworth and Garaleah Bailey are available for statements.

At approximately 0050 hours, Detective Savoie and Detective Diedling met with Garaleah Bailey who identified herself as an Assistant Manager for Walmart, 8912 Veterans Boulevard, Kenner.

During interview Garaleah Bailey informed the detectives that a little after 7pm (1900 hours), she was notified by an associate that there was "someone" laying on the floor within the Family Restroom in the back of the store and had "cans" strewn about. Garaleah Bailey advised that the associate did not know what the "cans" were at that time. Due to the notification she, a second assistant manager named Neil, proceeded to the Family Restroom, where they met "Pink" (Pink Duckworth, Asset Protection Associate) and detail officer "Lieutenant McGregor" (Lieutenant Brian McGregor) who was attempting to enter the restroom, due to the subject locking it. Garaleah Bailey continued that she attempted to unlock the door, but was unsuccessful. However, "Pink" attempted to gain entry and was able to unlock it.

Upon opening the door, Garaleah Bailey observed a subject clad in all black laying on the floor with no shoes on with a can of compressed air in his hand. Garaleah Bailey recalled observing a backpack, multiple items of clothing and additional cans of compressed air strewn about (approximately seven cans).

Garaleah Bailey observed Lieutenant McGregor enter the Family Restroom and request the subject to put the can down, which he refused. Garaleah Bailey notified the detectives that she didn't observe the refusal, however Lieutenant McGregor requested him to lay down on the ground which she believed the subject also refused as "Pink" entered the bathroom to assist. Garaleah Bailey advised that the door shut, at which time she heard Lieutenant McGregor again request the subject to roll over and lay down. Shortly thereafter she heard a "pop," which she believed was the taser. Garaleah Bailey stated that a "minute or so, maybe not even that long he was in handcuffs sitting up on the floor against the wall."

Garaleah Bailey later identified the associate who notified her of the incident as a cashier named Brenda Pittman, and the Assistant Manager who assisted/ accompanied her was named Niel Vedros.

Garaleah Bailey described the subject as a light skinned, black male, clad in all black, no shoes, and no socks.

As the interview continued Detective Savoie asked if the subject had purchased the merchandise, which Garaleah Bailey advised that he had not. This was verified via the business's video surveillance system. Garaleah Bailey advised that the subject had stolen two packs of the compressed air, with an aggregate value \$23.94.

When questioned if Garaleah Bailey observed the subject being belligerent or violent, she advised "no," but she did see him attempt to stand up on multiple occasions. Garaleah Bailey described his behavior as being "non-compliant."

Detective Diedling inquired if Garaleah Bailey was aware of any incidents similar happening at any nearby Walmart, which she advised "yeah." Garaleah Bailey advised that after notifying the Asset Protection Manager and Store Manager, the Asset Protection Manager advised that the Walmart at 300 West Esplanade Ave, they had a similar incident in which a male was observed "huffing" compressed air. However, Garaleah Bailey was notified that the subject was never detained. When asked who would have additional information pertaining to the incident, she advised the loss prevention agent Ruthie Brown.

Garaleah Bailey's interview was digitally recorded and provided to Kenner Police administrative assistants for transcribing. A copy of the transcribed statement will be attached to this report.

At approximately 0102 hours, Detective Savoie and Detective Diedling met with Pink Duckworth, who identified himself as Asset Protection for Walmart, 8912 Veterans Boulevard, Kenner.

During interview Pink Duckworth advised that he was advised by an associate that he needed to see something in the bathroom. Upon entering the bathroom he observed a male with an aerosol can in his mouth. Pink Duckworth contacted the off duty detail officer, Lieutenant McGregor and informed him what was witnessed. Pink Duckworth advised that he was watching the male with the bathroom door open, until Lieutenant McGregor arrived.

However prior to Lieutenant McGregor's arrival the male stood up, stumbling and "walked into a wall," striking his head (contusion above right eye). The female associate shut the door, possibly in fear, after which time the male locked the door from the inside.

Pink Duckworth advised that he was eventually able to utilize a key and unlock the door. Upon entry the male was observed sitting back on the floor inhaling an aerosol can, Lieutenant McGregor entered and requested the male to put the can down which the subject was "basically incoherent." Lieutenant McGregor removed the aerosol can from the subject's hand, at which time the subject reached for a second can. Lieutenant McGregor requested for the subject to "lay on his belly and place his hands behind his back, which he refused." Lieutenant McGregor then attempted to grasp the subject's hand which the subject still resisted, and continued to reach for additional cans. Lieutenant McGregor advised the subject that he was going to get "tazed," if he did not cooperate. Lieutenant McGregor eventually "tazed," the subject, which Pink Duckworth believed had "no effect" on the subject. When asked why he believes "tazing" had no effect, Pink Duckworth answered that the subject said "ow" once toward the end of the five second cycle.

The subject was eventually handcuffed by Lieutenant McGregor as he continued to reach for cans. Once handcuffed he was seated against the wall of the bathroom, when approximately three or four additional "deputies," or officers arrived to assist. Pink Duckworth advised that even with the additional "deputies" the subject continued to be uncooperative, as he attempted to stand multiple times. The "deputies" had to place him back down several times. Upon securing the subject Emergency Medical services (EMS) were contacted in order to check on the subject's medical status. Once EMS arrived they conducted a field medical evaluation then escorted him to the ambulance for transport.

Pink Duckworth was unable to provide the associate's name that alerted him of incident, but described her as a black female cashier.

Pink Duckworth notified the detectives that he observed eight cans within the bathroom with the subject, when asked if the subject utilized all eight, Pink Duckworth advised that four cans were completely empty, and that he had watched the male attempt to inhale two additional cans orally. When asked how he knew the male was ingesting the contents, Pink Duckworth advised that he observed ice forming on the can.

Detective Savoie inquired if Pink Duckworth was aware of a similar incident happening elsewhere in the area, which he advised that he heard after the fact of a "huffing" incident happening at the Walmart on "West Esplanade" (300 W. Esplanade Avenue, Kenner). Pink Duckworth continued that he is unsure if was is the same person as he was told the person was not apprehended nor has he seen the video photograph to compare the two subjects. The incident at the "West Esplanade" store allegedly occurred prior to this incident, unknown time frame.

Detective Diedling asked if Pink Duckworth observed the subject become combative or flail his arms at any time during his or Lieutenant McGregor interaction, which he advised not that he could recall.

When questioned about the subject's behavior, Pink Duckworth advised before entering the subject had like "a blank daze on his face, like not understanding what was going on." As time passed the subject inquired to why he was being arrested, and for the officers to take the handcuffs off. When he was informed that he stole merchandise, the subject advised that he had purchased the compressed air cans, however the video shows otherwise.

Pink Duckworth's interview was digitally recorded and provided to Kenner Police administrative assistants for transcribing. A copy of the transcribed statement will be attached to this report.

Upon completion of the interviews it was learned that the compressed air canisters, "Dust-Off," were never seized as evidence. The canisters were later collected as evidence.

At approximately 0106 hours, Crime Scene Technician Sean Carson arrived at Ochster Kenner, during which time Austin Boyles' property was seized and photographs were taken. The seized property was later submitted as evidence under this Kenner item number.

Technician Carson will provide a supplement report at a later date.

Detective Rieke later notified Detective Savoie that Investigator Julia Powers arrived on scene for the unrelated death. Julia Powers later took possession of Austin Boyles' body and

later had him transported to the Jefferson Parish Forensic Center for an autopsy to be performed.

At approximately 0100 hours, Sergeant Schouest met with Officer Matthew Bondio, and advised him of his rights via Kenner Advice of Rights number A-96674, which he signed waiving his rights and wishing to provide a statement.

During interview Officer Bondio advised that he was En-route to "lockup" when he heard Lieutenant McGregor request for an additional unit to 8912 Veterans (Walmart) in reference to subject who had barricaded himself into a bathroom. Officer Bondio Continued that a second unit also advised that he was also En-route to the location to assist, Officer Zurita (Officer Joshua Zurita).

Upon their arrival, Officer Bondio advised that Officer Zurita entered the Walmart first. Lieutenant McGregor informed Kenner Police Dispatch that he was located in the bathroom, which Officer Zurita then proceeded to the bathrooms located in the front of the business. As Officer Zurita was approaching the restrooms he was approached by a few employees who informed him and Officer Bondio that Lieutenant McGregor was located in the rear bathrooms near "pick up," and lay away. Officer Bondio informed Sergeant Schouest that he and Officer Zurita started running towards the rear bathrooms. Officer Bondio continued that once he arrived he observed the suspect (Austin Boyles) was lying on his chest and handcuffed.

As the interview continued Officer Bondio advised that he observed one taser prong sticking out of his shirt just hanging, as it had not punctured the skin. The other taser prong was observed by Officer Bondio dangling on the ground. Officer Bondio continued that after walking through the bathroom entry door he also observed on the left hand side of the room clothes, a backpack, and approximately ten cans of the keyboard cleaner.

Once inside both he and Officer Zurita picked up the suspect and sat him up against the wall, so that he was seated up. Officer Bondio and Officer Zurita began to interview the suspect which appeared to be coherent. During interview the suspect informed the officers that he worked at Olive Garden, and that he lived with his parents in Chateau Estates on Medoc Street.

Officer Bondio advised that Lieutenant McGregor then requested Emergency Medical Services (EMS) due to the suspect "huffing cans." Officer Bondio added that he observed approximately three to five empty cans lying on the bathroom floor. Officer Bondio stated that shortly thereafter the suspect notified the officers that he had "huffed" more cans than that (like six or seven cans).

During which time Patrol Sergeant Greg Smith arrived on scene.

East Jefferson EMS arrived on scene and met with the Officer Bondio and the suspect, who notified the medical technician that he had huffed approximately seven cans. The medical technician requested for a transport unit, which Sergeant Smith requested Officer Bondio to accompany.

Once in the rear of the ambulance Officer Bondio advised that the suspect was observed to be coherent. While being transported Officer Bondio inquired to how long the suspect had been "huffing the cans," which the suspect stated that he had huffed in the past, but stopped for a while. However he recently started up again this past week, at which time the suspect began dry heaving and eventually vomited into a can. Once the suspect completed vomiting he again began speaking clearly and appeared to be coherent. Once at the hospital (Ochsner Kenner, 180 W. Esplanade Avenue, Kenner) the suspect was transferred to emergency room the medical personnel checked his vitals, and placed him in room number 4 for observation.

Officer Bondio informed Sergeant Schouest the tending medical personnel provided the suspect medication, along with Neosporin for the burn marks which were observed on his chest and arms. Sergeant Schouest inquired if the medical personnel explained how the suspect had sustained the "burn marks," which he advised "yeah they did." Officer Bondio continued that they explained that when the subject turns the can upside down and begins to "huff" the can it gets extremely cold, that when the subject passes out from the side effects of "huffing," that the can falls on the subject and burns the skin after a few minutes.

During interview Officer Bondio advised that he observed that the subject had the following injuries: a brush burn to the right side on his forehead, and one burn mark on his chest. However you couldn't see the additional burn marks until he reached the hospital and his long sleeved shirt was removed.

Officer Bondio recalled that while the suspect was being treated by the nurses, the suspect requested water, but was denied. The nurse explained to the suspect that he had been vomiting and that the water will just make him vomit even more. The nurse continued that if the suspect did not vomit for twenty minutes then she will provide a cup of ice. During that time frame the suspect vomited once again, restarting the twenty minute time frame. During the second countdown the suspect did not vomit again, and the nurse provided him a cup of ice.

A short time afterwards, the physician approached Officer Bondio and informed him that the suspect will most likely be discharged within an hour. While waiting Officer Bondio advised that he overheard the physician say something about Room 4, will not be discharged as of yet. Officer Bondio was unable to provide a reason to why, he presumed that the medical personal found something wrong with the tests. After thirty minutes or so, the suspect's body suddenly jerked and his whole body "went stiff and locked up." After five seconds of the alarms going off Officer Bondio exited the door and notified medical personnel who entered the room. The nurses checked for a pulse which yielded no life signs. Officer Bondio advised that the nurses requested the physician the room, at which time Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) was initiated, and he was hooked up to an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Officer Bondio recalled that the medical personnel "shocked" the suspect twice using the AED. Additional medical personnel entered the room and assisted providing chest compressions. The suspect was transported to the "trauma room, room 13" where they continued to work on him. While in the room 13, Officer Bondio contacted his rank and apprised them of situation.

Sergeant Schouest inquired if Officer Bondio observed the suspect being combative at any time, which Officer Bondio advised that when he arrived he handcuffed and not combative. He was however non-compliant, the suspect attempted to stand up multiple times which he was thus place back down in a seated position.

Officer Bondio's interview was digitally recorded and provided to Kenner Police administrative assistants for transcribing. A copy of the transcribed statement will be attached to this report.

At approximately 0143 hours, Sergeant Schouest met with Officer Joshua Zurita and advised him of his rights via Kenner Advised of Rights Form number A-96675, which he signed waiving his rights wishing to provide a statement.

During interview Officer Zurita advised that he responded to "8912 Veterans," which is one of the Walmart stores that the Kenner Police Department handles, in reference to a subject who had barricaded himself in a bathroom.

Officer Zurita continued that upon his arrival at the location the detail officer (Lieutenant McGregor) who was inside the business advised of a "108," which Officer Zurita explained is a common term used for an officer needing assistance, possibly combative subject, or "stuff like that." Officer Zurita informed Sergeant Schouest that once inside the building he proceeded to the front bathrooms which he discovered was empty. Next Officer Zurita walked to the Customer Service area and started asking, which he was directed to the rear of the store. Officer Zurita approached the rear of the business at which time people began pointing saying "they're in there." Upon opening the bathroom door Officer Zurita observed Pink Duckworth, Lieutenant McGregor, and a subject who was lying on the ground handcuffed, however Officer Zurita could not recall if he was on his stomach or on his side. While inside the bathroom Officer Zurita observed a wire from a taser which was attached to the prong, several air duster cans, clothes, and a backpack.

Officer Zurita informed Sergeant Schouest that he and Officer Bondio sat the suspect up and began talking to him. The suspect repeatedly requested for the officers to take the handcuffs off which Officer Zurita advised that he can't do that, but EMS is coming to take a look at him. Officer Zurita inquired to where the suspect work, which the suspect answered "Olive Garden."

Sergeant Schouest inquired if Officer Zurita observed any marks or injuries to the suspect, which Officer Zurita advised he did observe marks to his upper body, but he could not tell if they were bruising or something else.

Officer Zurita continued that the suspect was observed to be non-compliant, squirming around a lot and wishing to stand up. Officers had to sit him back down repeatedly.

At approximately 0148 hours, Detective Savoie arrived at the Kenner Police Complex.

At approximately 0205 hours, Detective Savoie and Sergeant Schouest and met with Lieutenant McGregor and advised him of his rights via Kenner Advice of Rights Form number A-96673, which he signed waiving his rights and wishing to provide a statement.

During interview Lieutenant McGregor advised that he was working the off duty detail for Walmart, 8912 Veterans Boulevard, store number 0989.

When asked what occurred while at Walmart, Lieutenant McGregor advised that at 7:05 pm he received a phone call from Pink Duckwork notifying him that an individual was inside the rear restroom inhaling "dust off" air canisters. Lieutenant McGregor advised that he proceeded to the rear restroom the entry door which was initially open. While at the entry door it immediately closed and was locked, at which time Lieutenant McGregor advised he could hear the inhalant going off for within. Lieutenant McGregor requested multiple times for the occupant to open the door, which he refused. Lieutenant McGregor requested for a key to the restroom, but was told there wasn't one. Lieutenant McGregor advised that he was instructed to "kick" the door. Lieutenant McGregor assessed the door and observed the door to be metal with a steel frame, Lieutenant McGregor knew his attempts to forcefully open the door were going to be unsuccessful. Lieutenant McGregor informed Detective Savoie that Pink Duckworth arrived shortly thereafter and used "something to open" the door. Lieutenant McGregor advised that he entered the bathroom with his taser out due to possibly having an altercation, as the suspect had been in the bathroom for quite some time, the suspect has been refusing to obey commands, and it's unknown if the suspect had any weapons. Once inside Lieutenant McGregor observed the suspect was leaning against the north wall with an air can to his face. Lieutenant McGregor advised he kicked the can from his hand. The suspect immediately slide across the floor to obtain a second inhaler (air duster) which was lying on the bathroom floor, at which time a struggle ensued. Lieutenant McGregor advised that he attempted to back up, at which time the suspect went for the

Lieutenant's waist (gun belt/ utility belt). Lieutenant McGregor deployed his Taser X26 device to the suspect's rear left side, which was ineffective. Lieutenant McGregor advised that he believed only one probe from the taser stuck as the suspect only stated "ow," or "ouch," nothing else. Lieutenant McGregor then changed his taser cartridge and tossed his taser to the corner in order to go "hands on" with the suspect. Both Lieutenant McGregor and Pink Duckworth struggled with the suspect, but were eventually able to subdue the suspect and place him in handcuffs.

Detective Savoie questioned Lieutenant McGregor to explain how the suspect "went for his waist," which Lieutenant McGregor advised that the suspect was on the ground and the suspect started to rise up from the ground on his waistline.

When asked who responded to the incident, Lieutenant McGregor informed the detective that Pink Duckworth, Garaleah, and Neil along with some additional employees. However the employees were requested to leave.

Detective Savoie inquired if the suspect was flailing for the air duster when the suspect slid across the floor for the second can. Lieutenant McGregor advised that the suspect was in a seated position at first however when he kicked the can from the suspect's hand, the suspect flopped to the front and slid to the second can. Lieutenant McGregor bent over and struggled with the suspect over the second can in an attempted to gain control over him. Lieutenant McGregor advised that during the struggle the suspect attempted to get up onto his feet and come toward Lieutenant McGregor's waist, at which time Lieutenant McGregor deployed his taser. Lieutenant McGregor informed Detective Savoie and Sergeant Schouest that the suspect refused to comply and that he continuously attempted to stand up, which Lieutenant McGregor pushed the suspect back down in order to gain control once again.

Shortly afterwards Zurita arrived on scene in addition to EMS.

After initial medical assessment, Lieutenant McGregor and a newer officer whom he didn't know his name escorted the suspect to the ambulance which was awaiting outside the business.

Lieutenant McGregor was questioned if he was going to remove the handcuffs from the suspect which he denied. Lieutenant McGregor advised that he believed that the suspect was possibly hallucinating due to what he had been huffing.

Lieutenant McGregor continued that due to the previous altercation, an officer was requested to ride in the ambulance with the suspect even though the suspect advised that he wasn't going give the officers any problems.

While on scene Lieutenant McGregor recalled observing four cans on the floor (which he presumed to be emptied), two additional cans left within the plastic, one can which was in the suspect's hand which was kicked away, and a second can lying on the ground which the suspect lunged for (eight cans of air duster in total). Lieutenant McGregor assumed only four cans of the air duster were completely emptied.

Lieutenant McGregor stated that the suspect was talking and walking, and that he never would have thought that an incident like this would have occurred.

Lieutenant McGregor's interview was digitally recorded and provided to Kenner Police administrative assistants for transcribing. A copy of the transcribed statement will be attached to this report.

On July 16, 2018, at approximately 1940 hours, Detective Savoie met with Officer Nathan Hodges who advised that he was sitting in "Roll Call," when Lieutenant McGregor said he was in a "108," over the radio. Therefore they went en-route. While running/jogging within the business Lieutenant McGregor advised that the suspect had been tased and handcuffed. Officer Hodges informed Detective Savoie that due to the suspect being subdued, he began walking to the rear restroom. Once he arrived at the rear of the store Officer Hodges informed Detective Savoie that he observed Lieutenant McGregor standing outside the bathroom with the bathroom door shut. Officer Hodges spoke to Lieutenant McGregor briefly who explained that everything was "ok," however the guy is still in there and "he is still trying to stand up on the other officer who is in there." Officer Hodges entered the restroom and observed the suspect who was in a seated in an upright position, attempting to stand up. Officer Hodges recalled observing Officer Bondio, a second officer (who's identity he could not remember at that time), five or six cans of air, along with the taser wiring on the floor, and possibly a backpack.

Officer Hodges continued that while inside he observed the suspect was "okay" and "not really resisting," however the suspect would attempt to stand up by rocking forward and attempt to gain stability on his feet, which he was then seated back down by the officers within the restroom.

Officer Hodges described the suspect as being a younger light skinned black male, thin build, who appeared to be disoriented and confused as if he was possibly under the influence of something.

Detective Savoie inquired if Officer Hodges heard the suspect say anything, which he advised that the suspect requested the officers to remove the handcuffs, and that he didn't do anything wrong.

Detective Savoie inquired if Officer Hodges observed the prongs of the taser, which Officer Hodges advised yes. Officer Hodges informed the detective that he observed one taser prong lying on the bathroom floor, and the second prong which was located on the back of the suspect was sticking through the suspect's shirt (he could see the probe).

Officer Hodges confirmed that the prong was not lodged in the suspect's skin at the time he observed.

When asked what Officer Grayson meant when he stated "pushing," he explained that the officers were pressing his shoulders down and just preventing him from stating up. The officers were trying to keep him calm and seated.

Detective Savoie inquired if any of the officers notified the suspect why the handcuffs were not going to be removed, which Officer Grayson said that someone had informed the suspect that he was being detained or arrested.

While inside the restroom Officer Grayson observed approximately four to five cans of air duster, boxers (men's underwear), and taser probes which were both attached to the suspect's shirt.

Officer Grayson's interview was digitally recorded and provided to Kenner Police administrative assistants for transcribing. A copy of the transcribed statement will be attached to this report.

Sergeant Smith advised that he left the Kenner Police Complex to 8912 Veterans Boulevard, The Walmart, due to units responding and a "resisting arrest" call was advised.

Upon arrival Sergeant Smith met with EMS Sprint unit medical technician proceeded to enter the business where they encountered Lieutenant McGregor. Sergeant Smith informed Detective Savoie that Lieutenant McGregor requested for a "stretcher," however due to the EMS vehicle being a sprint unit and not a transportation unit one was not available at that time. ailments. Sergeant Smith advised that the subject was very lethargic in speech and answering questions.

Detective Savoie reviewed all of the hyperlinks associated to the searched terms which revealed that Austin Boyles was possibly attempting to locate the addresses and physical locations of not only Walmart, but also Target. In addition Austin Boyles was possibly researching the physical effects and side effects of "huffing duster."

Detective Savoie reviewed one website listed within the query <https://www.therecoveryvillage.com/air-duster-abuse/air-duster-high/#gref> which described the effects of huffing a full can of "Air Duster" as a "short-lived" euphoric high which could potentially kill a first time abuser.

WEB HISTORY:

Detective Savoie next reviewed the web history which yielded one additional queries that resulted in a website (<https://americanaddictioncenters.org/inhalant-abuse/side-effects/>).

Upon reviewing the website titled "Huffing Canned Air or Dust Off: Side Effects, Signs and More". The detective observed it to list several immediate hazards such as: Trouble breathing, nausea, vomiting, disorientation, suffocation, Seizures, Asphyxiation, Lack of oxygen to the brain, Loss of motor control and coordination, and etc...

While visiting the site, Detective Savoie observed a "pop up" requesting the detective to chat with a counselor as the addiction is lethal.

VIDEOS:

Video named 55180931837__0836DE15-C4A7-4088-B3F1-38DBDC47817C.MOV depicts an unknown dark skinned subject's hand holding a white sheet of paper with words "Relapse Prevention" (8 classes) written on the top. Underneath is written "Orientation- Mondays 10am, Every class \$15", along with Classes available- Monday @ 1pm, Wednesday 3pm, Thursday @ 11am".

A google query of the term "Relapse Prevention" yielded a Drug Addiction Program provided by multiple agencies. The program is designed to identify the triggers of substance abuse, stages if relapse and provide techniques for dealing with the Mental Urges.

A copy of the forensic analysis was submitted as evidence under this Kenner item number.

Copies of the transcribed statements are attached to this investigative report and were also copied to C.D. ROMS as evidence.

On August 1, 2018, at approximately 2040 hours, Detective Savoie contacted Michael Simms, who identified himself as Austin Boyles' step-father. During the conversation Michael Simms requested to meet with the detective in order to speak with him in reference to the incident.

At approximately 2104 hours, Detective Savoie met with Michael Simms and Brandi Sims, Austin Boyles' mother. While on scene Brandi Simms requested to know what had occurred, the detective notified Brandi Simms that her son was caught on video surveillance footage stealing merchandise and possibly huffing that particular merchandise. During the conversation Brandi Simms and Michael Simms informed the detective that they had attempted to get Austin help for his addiction (Teen Challenge Program); however he would never stay to finish. Brandi Simms advised that she believed her son possibly "huffed" in order to bypass drug screenings.

On October 10, 2018, at approximately 1450 hours, Detective Savoie received Austin Boyles Autopsy Report (Case number 343-18) and Toxicology screening.

Upon reviewing the Autopsy report which was prepared by Dr. Y. Van Vo, Detective Savoie observed that Austin Boyles death was classified as an "Accident." Based on the decedent's history of huffing, timeline of events, and clinical course, it is in the opinion of the pathologist that the cause of death is best described as Acute 1, 1 Difluoroethane Toxicity.

Detective Savoie further read that "it is noted that while a law enforcement encounter with electro-muscular disruption device discharge occurred, it is not a contributor to the cause of death."

The autopsy report and toxicology report will be submitted under this Kenner item number.

Based on the above information, facts, and opinion of Pathologist Van Vo, M.D., declaring Austin Boyles's death as an Accident, Detective Savoie requests this case to be closed.
