AS: Alright, today's date is July 13th, 2018; it is currently 0211 hours. My name is Detective Aaron Savoie. Today with me is Detective Adam, Sergeant Adam Schouest and we will be interviewing Lieutenant Brian McGregor in reference to a incident under Kenner item number G-Golf-8-D-6-4-D-18. Um, Lieutenant McGregor, can you please state your name?

BM: Yes. First name is Brian; B-R-I-A-N. Last name McGregor; M-E-G-R-E-G-O-R.

AS: Alright, uh earlier today were you advised of your rights?

BM: Yes.

AS: Alright, with that being said you did sign that advice of rights form wishing to provide a statement?

BM: Yes, I did sign a form waving right and agreeing to give a statement.

AS: Alright, um, earlier today you were involved in a incident.

BM: Correct.

AS: Alright, uh, were did that incident occur at?

BM: I was working the off duty detail at the Walmart located at 89-12 Veterans Blvd store number 0 9 8 9.

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AS: Okay. What happened at Walmart?

BM: Um, as you can see on my phone right here I got a call from Pink Duckworth at 705 pm. Notifying me that there was a individual that was in a rear restroom, um, you know, inhaling air, the dust off air. Uh, I went back to the back, to the bathroom. Uh, when I got back there initially the door was open. It immediately closed and locked. Then I could hear the, the Inhaler going off inside the bathroom. Um, at that point, um, I couldn't get into the bathroom. I asked for a key. Uh, I, they told me I didn't have a key. They did notify me go ahead and just kick the door. I noticed the door had a steel frame and steel door. I knew that kicking the door wasn't going to be successful. Um, so I asked if somebody could manipulate the door and that's when Pink Duckworth, the, uh, AP over there used something to open the door. Uh, before I entered the, uh, bathroom I had my taser out because, you know, I felt like it was going to be an altercation because you know this individual had been in there for quite some time. You know, while I was outside the door I could hear, you know, while we are still trying to get the door, the inhaling going off inside. So I felt it would probably be an altercation once I got inside. Um, as soon as the door open the individual was seated against the, uh, let's see it would be the north wall. Uh, he had one of the inhalers up to his face. I kicked it from his hand. That's when he immediately tried to slide across the floor to grab another inhaler. Uh, and that's when he began the struggle on the floor. You know, he tried to get up. You know, I had my taser drawn. I hit him with the taser one time. I think it was on the rear left side. I don't think the probes all went in 'cause, uh, Pink... 'Cause he only said ow, he only said ow or ouch. He just made a simple comment. And then, um, you know immediately since I don't have the double taser I immediately just took that one, cartridge off threw it to the floor because I was going to dry stun him if I had too. Then I realized that you know, you know I could probably go hands on with him. So I tried to hand my taser off to Pink and I ended up throwing it in the corner because I just decided to go hands on with the individual on the ground. And, uh, as we were struggling to get the handcuffs on him, you know Pink helped me get him handcuffed and we just sat him up on the floor. Once we sat him up on the floor he kept trying to get up and I kept pushing him back down to the floor. Officer Zurita was the first officer on scene. I notified dispatch that the individual was, barricaded himself in the, uh, in the bathroom and I notified him of the 108 over the radio that I needed assistance when we started fighting on the floor. So, and what he did he tried to... when I say fighting on the floor he was, you know, I had him on the floor, but he kind of raised up and was coming towards my waist line and that's when I, we kind of spun around and I hit him with the taser and that's when the probes, uh, went into him. But, I mean it was just a short path and, you know Pink told me he didn't think one of them had, uh, you know, 'cause Pink use to work for the St. Charles Sheriff Office. He said he didn't think one of the probes had gone in him.

SS: Okay.

AS: Okay. You remember where, where you, where the probes hit?

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BM: I think on the, if I'm not mistaken I think one is on the left side. I didn't see where the other one was. 'Cause like I said I immediately took the cartridge out threw it to the floor because I was going to thereafter just dry stun him if I had to. And I just realized, you know, this guys is hallucinating. I'm bigger than him I could probably just go hands on with him and keep him down and that's exactly what I did.

AS: Alright.

BM: So...

AS: ... you said he was going towards you waist what you...

BM: Yea, he just kind of, like I said he was on the ground. He, you know, how you just rise up from the ground, like coming to my waist area. I, you know, I knew that would, might be awkward and, so I just, like I said I just continued just to fight through it and just you know put him down. You know, I did notice, you know after he was on the ground and, you know, we got him back it looked like he had a little hickey on the neck, looked like he had a, um, something on his chest. I don't know how that would have occurred, you know, but like I said we did have a altercation and prob, likely did hit his head off the, you know interior floor in the bathroom.

AS: Okay.

BM: So when Zurita got there, like I said, uh, he got there and the other officers got there. Like I said you can see on the video tape that, you know, after they walked inside he continued to get up several times with the other offices and they kept telling him sit back down, sit back down. And you know, eventually I just exited the room 'cause, you know, we had enough officers there. And I wind up snapping a picture as well, I just sent y'all in a email as well.

AS: Alright.

BM: I kind of felt with all the officers coming in, you know, the scene might get messed up a little bit. It appeared things were starting to get moved because of the amount of people that were in the room. But, you know, when the door initially closed it was only the individual in there by himself. You know when I entered the bathroom it was me and Pink that entered the bathroom. Um, like I said he was seated on the north wall, inhaler in hand. You know, he was using it. I kicked it from his hand, that's when he tried to slide across the floor. When I got him again, that's when he kind of, we started tussling that's when he came up towards the waist line and that's when, uh, like I said I hit him with the taser. So like I said 'cause we were going back and forth on the floor a little bit so, but when he came up, you know, because I was just bent over. So that's when he came up and that's when I hit him with the taser. Like I said because I was able to spin him around and catch him on the back side.

AS: Okay. You said the, the, uh, inhaler was in his hand, what was he doing with the inhaler?

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BM: So.

AS: Alright, when, uh, when you entered and you kicked the inhaler and he was going for the other can was he flailing for the other can or was he just laying down on the ground?

BM: No, he was in the seated position at first and then, uh, as soon as I kicked the inhaler he just kind of just flopped to the front and tried to slide to grab a can and me and him started with the altercation. Like I said he was bent over so he was able to get up onto his feet, you know like coming towards my waist and that's when I, uh, hit him with the taser.

AS: Okay.

BM: So...

AS: Alright, you said...

BM: ...than like I said, I felt like, you know, I was going to hit him with the taser again and I realized, hey look, uh, you know let me so I flipped like the, uh, cartridge off and threw it and then, uh, you know, I was going to dry stun him. Decided not too and just go hands on with him, you know, 'cause I felt like I could get him on the floor.

AS: Okay.

BM: I wind up throwing the taser in the corner because I was going to hand it off to Pink and I think that wasn't a good idea either so I just wanted to get it out the way.

AS: Okay.

BM: So...

AS: Alright, so when the...

BM: I know what happened, I mean after that you know we, uh, Zurita gets there EMS was called 'cause we knew he had, you know consumed the, uh dust off is what it was.

AS: Uh huh.

BM: Um, EMS gets there, they check him out, you know, he keeps trying to get up off the floor. Um, you know initially I told them why don't you bring in the stretcher, we will put him on the stretcher, ya know, to take him out. And they decided hey look, let just walk him out. So myself and whatever the other officer was, I don't know he's a new officer. Myself and another officer wind up walking him out to the, uh, stretcher. We sat him on the stretcher. You know, they asked me if I was going to remove the handcuffs from him. I said no, I wasn't

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removing the hand cuffs from him. Because it appeared he was still hallucinating. You could see it in his eyes. His eyes were big and, uh, I didn't want him to give the EMTs any trouble. We wind up putting a police officer in the back of the EMS unit to ride to the hospital with him and, uh, just in case he gave in trouble on the way to the hospital. So...

AS: Okay.

BM: Then...

AS: How was, uh, his demeanor or behavior as, uh...

BM: You could tell he was hallucinating, um, he wasn't listening to verbal instructions to stay seated on the floor. Like I said several officers probably pushed him back onto the floor and they kept trying to explain to him to stay seated on the ground. So, you know, he wasn't, you could tell, whatever he was that he was, you know, had consumed was taking effects because he appeared to be hallucinating, you know, not following verbal instructions or anything like that. So...

AS: Okay. Was he saying anything?

BM: No, he just kind of mumbling.

AS: Mumbling?

BM: Yea, just kind of mumbling. 'cause you could tell he was high because his head was just kind of rocking to the right and left and all over the place. He kept trying to get up and, uh, the biggest thing we just tried kept him seated on the ground so...

AS: Okay. Once he got in the ambulance did he say anything or...

BM: No, he just...

AS: Was he continuing to mumble?

BM: We got him on the ambulance, when I refused to remove the cuffs from him, you know, thinking there might be further problem. Um, you know they, uh, he said he wouldn't give us any problems. I said that's okay, and they just put him in the back, put the officer in the back and they went to Kenner Regional.

AS: Okay. Okay. Um...

BM: You know I only gave him, um, you know the one, I only him ¹once with the taser, I would believe for probably the full five seconds.

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AS: Alright, would you say the taser was affective?

BM: No, because he only said ouch. So... he only said ouch and that's when Pink kind of made me aware that only one of the probes went in him, not both.

AS: Okay.

BM: So...

AS: And the, uh...

BM: 'Cause like I said we were, like I said when we were struggling we were going back and forth. Like I said when I go in I go in with the taser, you know because he's already barricaded. You know, inside I don't know if he had a weapon or anything like that. I'm already looking for a altercation because he's not listening to verbal instructions to open up the door or anything like that.

AS: Uh-huh.

BM: So I'm already believing we are going to have a altercation. You know, I know he's consuming that air, I know he's probably hallucinating, probably going to fight so I go in there. I see him consuming the air, I kick it from his hand. You know, he's seated and that's when he tries to slide over and we start struggling. That's when he comes up to the waist, you know, I kind of spin him, I hit him with the taser and all he says is ouch. You know and at that point, you know, like I said that's when I try to hand it off to Pink and I wind up just throwing it in the corner and decide to go hands on with him on the ground. So...

AS: Okay. Where you able to, and of course you were able to, uh, subdue him?

BM: Yes, I was able to handcuff him and, uh, like I said Zurita was the first officer on scene. Like I said I went ahead and, you know, let headquarters know I have a barricade subject in the bathroom and then, um, when I, probably as I tased him I kicked in the 108. So...

AS: Alright, alright. You have any questions?

BM: I, I, like I said I saw, um, you know, I was told that he probably consumed anywhere from four to seven cans. I don't know how many cans, I know there were two packages of four that were on the floor.

AS: Uh-huh.



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BM: And I know four cans were likely empty. And like I said he was already inhaling one and I don't know about the other one. He tried to slide, because I know it wasn't.. There were two of them that were still in the plastics, I don't believe those two were used. I know there were four cans on the floor and there was one being used by him that was in his hand that I kicked from him and he tried to slide across and he grabbed the other one. So that's when, you know, I don't know if he actually hit the inhaler to start inhaling or not, but like I said he slide trying to grab the other can and I, you know, that's when the struggle pursued.

AS: Okay. And you said right at during the struggle he somehow got to his feet?

BM: Yea, he started getting to his feet, like I said getting to his feet, you know coming to my waist like and that's when I kind of spun him and that's when I just pulled the trigger on the taser, it hit him on the left side and like I said he hit the ground and, uh, and, uh, I pushed him down and all he said was ouch.

AS: Okay.

BM: That's all he said was ouch. So...

AS: Alright, and being that, uh, he was coming for your waist line what did you perceive?

BM: Yea, I just, I mean, I was just trying to gain control of him and trying to get him to where I could get him on the ground and get him handcuffed. And like I said he wasn't responding to verbal commands 'cause I kept telling him to get on the ground, get on the ground and like I said we were going back and forth and like I said Pink wind up assisting me handcuffing him on the floor. So... 'Cause you know, Pink was to my right, you know, the individual was on the ground, I was on top and then, you know, top left side of him. And I just got the handcuffs on him and we just, I kind of sat him up after that so...

AS: Alright.

BM: And he kept trying to get up off the floor so... I just kept pushing him back down to where he would be in the seated position. Because I felt like if he would have got up he, there ain't not telling what he would have done with his hallucinations and so forth I didn't know if he would try to run or try to harm himself any further. So I just wanted him seated there until EMTs got there.

AS: Okay. Alright, alright. Is there any other questions that I failed to ask that you think, uh, could help me out?

BM: No, I mean like I said it's just one of those things. Like I said I never thought this would happen. He was talking when he got out to the ambulance and like I said, so I thought he was just fine. So... Like I said, the officer, you know told him to stay seated on the ground. Like I said they

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pushed him down a few times. And you know, like I said he walked, physically walked out of the bathroom to the ambulance, you know, with us just escorting him. And like I said we sat him down on the stretcher, you know, he told me he wouldn't give any problems after, you know, take the handcuffs off of him. But you know that wasn't going to ride either, so... because he was in custody, he was under arrest for what happened, plus they were going to pursue charges for the theft of the air anyway so. For the cans.

AS: Alright, alright. If there is nothing else this interview is now concluded; the time is now 0227 hours.

AS: Alright today's date is July 13th, 20-18 it is currently 00:50 hours. Um my names Detective Aaron Savoie today with me is Officer Detective Devin Diedling and we will be interviewing Ms. Garaleah Bailey. Ms. Bailey can you please state your name for record?

GB: Garaleah Bailey.

AS: And what's your date of birth?

GB: 11-10-82.

AS: And where do you currently work?

GB: Walmart at 89-12 Veterans.

AS: Alright, and what is your position there?

GB: Assistant manager.

AS: And how long you been working there? (radio talk in the background)

GB: Uh with Walmart, for eleven years.

AS: Okay, what uh, and I understand you had um your involvement in an incident or witnessed an incident today?

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GB: Yes.

AS: Okay, can you please uh describe what oc-, what occurred or what you witnessed?

GB: Yeah at about, uh probably a little bit after seven o'clock uh I was notified by an associate that there was someone in the family restroom in the back of the store and she said that he had cans, she didn't know what they were at that point, and he was laying on the floor. And so myself and another assistant manager, Neal went out to the family bathroom, at that point um McGregor and the AP Pink were already at the door trying to get in, they said he had locked the door and they couldn't get in. So I tried some of the keys on my keyring to try to get the bathroom door opened and then Pink managed to get his key in and it popped the door open. Um at that point there was um, a guy in all black laying on the floor with no shoes on, um he had a can of air in his hand and there was clothes and a backpack and like seven more cans of air all over the bathroom. And McGregor walked in with him and told him to put the air down and he, I guess he refused ca-, I didn't really see that part of it but he, I then heard him tell him to roll over so he could handcuff him, and I guess he guess he continued to refuse so Pink walked further in to help McGregor, and the door shut. And I heard McGregor (banging in the background) tell him to (knocking in the background), um...

AS: Okay continue.

GB: To roll over and then at that point I heard a pop, which was the Taser. And then a minute or so later, probably not even that long, they opened the door and he was in handcuffs, and he was sitting up in the floor against the wall.

AS: Okay, alright um the, who is the cashier? What's her name?

GB: Uh her name is Brenda Pitman.

AS: Brenda Pitman?

GB: Yeah.

AS: And what, what uh, what area does she work in?

GB: She's just a cashier.

AS: Just a cashier?

GB: Yes, she was just trying to go use that restroom and she opened the door, and it happened to be opened, and she found him laying in there.

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AS: Okay, uh Neal he's another manager you...

GB: Yeah.

AS: ..Were saying? What's his last name?

GB: Vedros.

AS: Okay. Um, and y'all two were notified the same time frame?

GB: Yeah we were in the office together when they came and got us.

AS: Okay, so y'all didn't actually witness, witness him in uh actually going into the restroom or anything...

GB: No he...

AS: (UNL both speaking over each other)

GB: ..Was already in there.

AS: Okay, um when you say cans of air, wh- what do you mean by cans of air?

GB: The duster who like, you use for a computer, like to clean your keyboard and...

AS: Okay. So c- you, so correct me if I'm wrong, compressed air?

GB: Compressed air yeah.

AS: Okay, alright um and how many cans you said?

GB: There was eight total.

AS: There was eight total? Okay um McGregor wh...

GB: Lieutenant McGregor.

AS: .. Lieutenant McGregor?

GB: Yeah.

AS: Okay. That's, I just wanted to clarify that. Um, okay. The uh, ¹the male what did he look like?

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GB: Uh he was a light skinned black male, I believe um dark hair, he was wearing black shirt, black pants, like dark gray socks. At that point he didn't have any shoes on.

AS: Okay. Have you ever seen him before?

GB: No.

AS: Okay so this your first time ever (UNI)...

GB: Yeah.

AS: ...Seeing this gentleman? Okay, alright um the uh, did he pay for that material?

GB: No.

AS: They, okay so there was no receipt, no attempt? Did you go back and the cameras the, to verify that?

GB: We verified it later, I actually verified it on phone cause I can scan the merchandise and see, check the sales.

AS: Okay.

GB: There, the only sale I had was yesterday on those, and my on hand said I had five that should be on the shelf I walked to where the shelf was, where they were on the shelf and there was three on the shelf.

AS: Okay.

GB: So we were missing two sets.

AS: So you're missing two sets?

GB: Yeah.

AS: Okay Alright so he, so you veri-, so you did verify...

GB: And then we verified it, he walked to electronics, selected it, went into the bathroom the first time, came out like um two hours later, got another set of four cans and went back into the bathroom.

AS: Okay so there's, so he...

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GB: There's...

AS: ..Two sets...

GB: ..Yeah two sets of four.

AS: Okay. (music playing in the background) Alright so wha-, what's the price of those cans?

GB: I uh, I think they were 11-97 a piece.

AS: 11-97 a piece? Okay, did uh, did you see him become violent at any time during the co-, during the uh contact with...

GB: He kept...

AS: ..With him?

GB: ..Trying to stand up.

AS: Okay.

GB: After he was handcuffed and he was sitting in the floor against the wall, he kept trying to stand up and McGregor would push him back down, ya need to sit down. And he would sit there for a minute and then he would try to stand back up again.

AS: Okay.

GB: And even when the other officers arrived, they had to tell him multiple times to sit down.

AS: Okay. So he just was not compliant?

GB: Yeah. Not at all.

AS: Okay, so he wasn't, he wasn't um physically fighting or?

GB: No he just wasn't listening to em, like he kept just trying to stand up.

AS: Okay. Okay, alright. Alright. Is there anything else that you observed that could uh help me in this investigation that I didn't ask you?

GB: Not that I know, no

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- AS: Okay, alright. Detective Dleding, do you have anything else?
- DD: Where you made aware that he, possible like instance another uh, uh other stores that might have involved the same person or?
- GB: Yeah, um after I contacted management. Oh I had to contact the asset protection manager and my store manager, um the asset protection manager called me back and said that she was notified by her manager that at the store on 3-0-0 West Esplanade, they had the same kind of incident with someone huffing the canned air, but he got away they didn't catch him.
- AS: Did they ever describe the uh subject?
- GB: No, I tried to contact the A-P at that store but she hasn't contacted me back yet.
- AS: Okay who's the A-P at that particular store?
- GB: Ruthie.
- AS: Ru-, what's her last name?
- GB: Ruthie Brown.
- AS: Ruthie Brown? Okay. Alright well did, and do y'all sell similar compressed air?
- GB: Yes.

AS: Today's Friday, July 13th, 2018; the time is 0150 hours. Um, my name is Sergeant Adam Schouest with the Kenner Police Department Criminal Investigation Division.
